Make Sabbath Worship Prominent

We are called to be holy, and we should carefully avoid giving the impression that it is of little consequence whether or not we retain the peculiar features of our faith. Upon us rests the solemn obligation of taking a more decided stand for truth and righteousness... The <u>line of demarcation between those who keep the commandments of God and those who do not is to be revealed with unmistakable clearness</u>. RH, August 4, 1904

We are to give to the world a manifestation of the pure, noble, holy principles that are to distinguish the people of God from the world. Instead of the people of God becoming less and less definitely distinguished from those who do not keep the seventh-day Sabbath, they are to <u>make the observance of the Sabbath so prominent</u> that the world cannot fail to recognize them as Seventh-day Adventist. Make Sabbath truth Prominant

This last warning to the inhabitants of the earth is to make men see the importance God attaches to his holy law. So plainly is the truth to be presented, that no transgressor, hearing it, shall fail to discern the importance of obedience to the Sabbath commandment. RH, March 26, 1908

Covering up the Sabbath

The people of the world will try to induce us to soften down our message, to suppress some of its more distinctive features. They say, "Why do you make the seventh-day Sabbath so prominent in your teaching? This difference is always thrust before us. We would harmonize with you if you would not say so much on this point. Let arguments in the Sentinel be free from mention of the seventh-day Sabbath, and we will give it our influence and support." This is their invitation to compromise, and there has been a disposition on the part of some of our workers to adopt this policy. But those who favor this action entertain deceptive sentiments, are bound by false modesty and caution, and manifest a disposition to withhold the confession of our faith. Seventh-day Adventists have discussed the feasibility of conceding to these demands; but shall we permit the world to shape the messages that God has given us to bear to them? Shall we entertain the proposals of Satan, and thereby entangle our souls... RH, January 31, 1893

Scorn Concealment

We are not to cringe, and beg pardon of the world for telling them the truth. We should scorn concealment. Unfurl your true colors to the gaze of men and angels. Let it be understood that Seventh-day Adventists can make no compromise. In our opinions and faith there must not be the least appearance of wavering. The world has a right to expect something of us, and will look upon us as dishonest, as hiding our real sentiments and principles out of policy, if we present even the semblance of being uncommitted. {RH, January 31, 1893

New Methods coming into the Church

A new order of things has come into the ministry. CTr 362

As a people we have been <u>greatly humiliated</u> by the course that some of our brethren in responsible positions have taken in <u>departing from the old landmarks</u>. There are those who, in order to carry out their plans, have by their words denied their faith.... Now, as never before, we need to see the danger of being led unguardedly away from loyalty to God's commandments. We need to realize that God has given us a decided message of warning for the world... Let our people beware of <u>belittling</u> the importance of the <u>Sabbath</u>, <u>in order to link up with unbelievers</u>. Let them beware of departing from the principles of our faith, <u>making it appear that it is not wrong to conform to the world</u>. CH 237

Books of a New Order

The enemy of souls has sought to bring in the supposition that a great reformation was to take place among Seventh-day Adventists, and that this reformation would consist in giving up the doctrines which stand as the pillars of our faith, and engaging in a process of reorganization.
